My father took a nice picture of me with the dolphins. That way everyone will believe that I saw them, especially my classmates,


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It was the best day of my life!

I will never forget this trip; I hope we can go back.






WHAT IS AUTISM?

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a Developmental Disorder that characterised by impairments in social, communication, and behaviour challenges and a restricted and repetitive repertoire of interests and activities.

CHARACTERISTICS OF AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS

- Individual with ASD have social communication challenges including verbal and nonverbal communication.
- Individual with ASD may have deficit in social interaction.
- Individual with ASD might have restricted, repetitive behaviours and unusual interest in objects.



FACT ABOUT INDIVIDUALS WITH AUTISM:

- Even that Autism is a lifelong disorder, but individuals with ASD can be get effective intervention that help them overcome their challenges.
- Changes in familiar activities, places or people can be stressful for individuals with ASD.
- Individual with ASD may have great ability in one area and great difficulty in another. **For example:** they may have an extremely good memory and being detailed orientated.
- Individual with ASD may have unusually strong reactions to one or more of their five senses.
- They do not look different than anyone else but they think, performance and talk differently.
- Autism can occur in any cultural and ethnic group, as well as across all socioeconomic levels.
- There are no two individuals with ASD are the same, and each individual with ASD has a combination of strengths, difficulties, and interests that make them unique.

AUTISTIC PEOPLE OFTEN HAVE OTHER CONDITIONS, LIKE:

- Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).
- Anxiety or depression.
- Epilepsy.

Three: Releasing periodicals publishing research papers and studies related to disability.




